A look into the energy efficiency of S&A

S&A Homes is one local builder participating in the Pennsylvania Energy Efficient New Homes Program. The State College-based company has more than a dozen new housing developments currently under way in Central Southwestern

Pennsylvania. S&A Homes eliminates the half-mile of cracks and gaps that the ENERGY STAR program estimates surround the windows and doors of an average home, preventing cold winter air from creeping in and warm air from escaping. In addition to sealing the gaps with foam or caulk, S&A hires an inspector to check that no openings are missed before dry wall and insulation are installed.

An effective insulation system is important to maintain even temperatures throughout the house.

two-inch rigid insulation and makes sure not to overlook vulnerable areas such as the attic-access hatch. A third-party inspection is performed to ensure the insulation is installed without gaps or buckling.

The energy effitives are available for ciency of the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) equipment is also important. In addition to installing ENERGY STAR equipment, S&A makes sure the equipment is appropriately sized to fit the square footage of the house. Improperly sized HVAC systems can lead to excessive wear and tear on the equipment as well as uncomfortable

"We often come across customers who have been told by an HVAC contractor that their equipment should produce a ton of cool air for every 500 square feet," said Bob Shoemaker, S&A Homes Construction Manager. "But they don't realize how airtight our houses are. The houses require a lot less air to heat and cool."

New rating system for home energy efficien-

To participate in the Pennsylvania Energy Efficient New Homes Program, builders must hire an independent auditor to evaluate the energy efficiency of their homes.

performance score of a home's energy efficiency, known as the S&A uses a triple layer of Home Energy Rating

System (HERS) Index, is calculated for each participating home. Generally, scores on the HERS Index range from 0 to 150, with a lower score indicating a said. "That way, every year energy-efficient

Knowing HERS score provides transparency to homebuyers looking to understand future energy use. The U.S. Department of Energy reports that a typical resale home scores 130 on the HERS Index, while a standard code-compliant home falls around 100.

S&A Homes was building homes with an average HERS score of 68 in natural gas communities and 77 in heat pump communities. With help from the Pennsylvania Energy Efficient New Homes Program, however, S&A lowered their scores to the mid-50s, according to Chaz Steffen, owner of Ideal Living Environments Inc, a Home Energy Rater who has inspected S&A Homes. For houses with a ground-source heat pump, S&A is scoring in the low

Shoemaker said that FirstEnergy incentives helped S&A cover the cost of technologies such as

water heaters. "We apply the incentive to researching and developing more efficient products," he we can be doing something a little bit better, a little bit

more efficient.' As the housing market gains momentum, tools such as the HERS Index play an important role in helping homebuyers find a more energy-effi-

"Every builder is claiming to be more energy efficient," said Chris Schoonmaker, President of S&A Homes Housing Division. "What we tell the customer is that the proof is in the Home Energy Rating Score.'


