

# FirstEnergy's Pennsylvania Electric Companies Energy Efficient New Homes Program

## Financial incentives are available for builders of new homes serviced by Met-Ed, Penelec, Penn Power or West Penn Power.

The program offers two incentive tiers for builders of homes that exceed the minimum energy code.

### Tier 1

- 30¢ per kWh saved per home
- Requires 20% savings over 2015 IECC\*

### Tier 2

- 35¢ per kWh saved per home
- Requires ENERGY STAR® V3.1 certification & 20% savings over 2015 IECC\*

With incentives measured by total kWh saved annually, the more builders save the more they earn. Builders of qualifying homes can earn a maximum incentive of \$4,500. For multifamily projects, builders can earn *thousands* of dollars per building with rebates issued on a per-unit basis.

Program participants are eligible to receive free technical trainings, marketing materials and recognition on the program website's *Builder Showcase*.

### Average rebates awarded to qualifying participants range by building type and heating fuel source.

All homes must be inspected and verified by a certified HERS Rater to qualify for program incentives.

ENERGY STAR-certified homes must also complete all V3.1 checklists.
